The Dragon Boat Festival or *Duanwu Jie* 端午节 falls on the fifth day of the fifth month of the lunar calendar, which this year is Monday, 14 June.



Traditional customs include racing dragon boats and eating glutinous rice wrapped in reed or bamboo leaves - *zongzi* 粽子. Fillings can be savoury (pork, sausage or duck eggs) or sweet (bean paste, jujube or nuts).
