Welcome to Winter! It seems we are in for a cold winter this year. May definitely gave us a taste of what we are in for.

I thought I would provide an update on events happening at Mawson Primary. For those who are new to ALMA, Mawson Primary provides a bilingual program as part of their curriculum. The model follows an immersion program between Chinese and English. The Mandarin Immersion Teaching team have planned some fantastic events for the students this term.

Students have had a visit from the Carrousel Theatre. Students from Kindergarten to Year 2 participated in an hour long English/Chinese bilingual puppet show of 'Aladdin 阿拉丁神灯'

Later on in the term, all students will take part in a Dragon Boat Festival Celebration Day. The Dragon Boat Festival (端午节Duān wǔ jié) is celebrated on the 5th day of the 5th month of the Chinese lunar calendar (农历nóng lì), which falls on Thursday 22 June this year. It is one of the traditional and important Chinese Festivals that has been celebrated by Chinese people for thousands of years. Students will have the opportunity to learn what is the Dragon Boat Festival, why it is celebrated and how people celebrate this festival through a variety of activities.

## CHINESE AUSTRALIAN EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTRE

At CAECC, children learn Mandarin through planned play experiences mostly based on children's interest and needs. We are starting to use the Early Years Planning Cycle version 2.0. This is where we observe the children, assess their learning, and draw on the information gathered to then plan to extend their learning and thinking. The plan is added to the program and implemented, then evaluated and reflected on. This gives us possibilities for moving forward in extending the children's learning.

In the past few months, the children have been learning about Aboriginal culture by printing Aboriginal symbols in sand, and listening to Aboriginal stories. Embedding Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives is a shared responsibility of all approved providers, educators, and other professionals working in early childhood educational settings, regardless of whether Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families are present.

The preschoolers have also learnt about reptiles and volcanoes. We had an exciting visit from the Reptile zoo where the children had the opportunity to see reptiles in real life.

Through these experiences the children continue to increase their language skills in Mandarin and English (particularly important for children whose first language is not English). As each child learns language at a different pace, there will be different results at the end of their stay with us. Some children will be able to use small sentences in Mandarin, some only some words and some may be reluctant to use any at all, however much they can understand.

In the infants and toddlers room we have had a lot of young babies start at the end of March. When young children start in our care, we work on building strong trusting relationships with them. For when children feel safe, secure and supported they grow in confidence to explore and learn.

The children will be celebrating the Dragon Boat Festival doing a number of learning experiences. They will construct and decorate some dragon boats and have a race. They will also have the opportunity to make Zongzi and listen to stories about the custom of the Dragon Boat Festival.

I'll leave you with this quote from O. Fred Donaldson, M.D. "Children not only acquire knowledge and skills through play but also develop essential learning skills such as curiosity, persistence, and adaptability".

#### **Mandarin Community Tutoring Project**
