#### Other language learning news

Regrettably, we have heard that there have been some reductions in funding for the language specific networks that support the professional development of language teachers at school level in the ACT. These networks are very important as they allow language teachers to meet teachers of the same language from other schools to help improve program planning and delivery.

We have also learnt that CIT will no longer offer Certificate III and IV language courses in Mandarin, Japanese, French and Spanish from 2012, and that all levels of the Certificate will cease to be offered from 2013. This removes one of the few ways Canberrans working full-time from 9 to 5 can study another language to a reasonable level of fluency in an accredited program.

Also discontinued is the part-time Graduate Diploma in Languages at the University of Canberra, which was available in Mandarin, Spanish, and Japanese.
